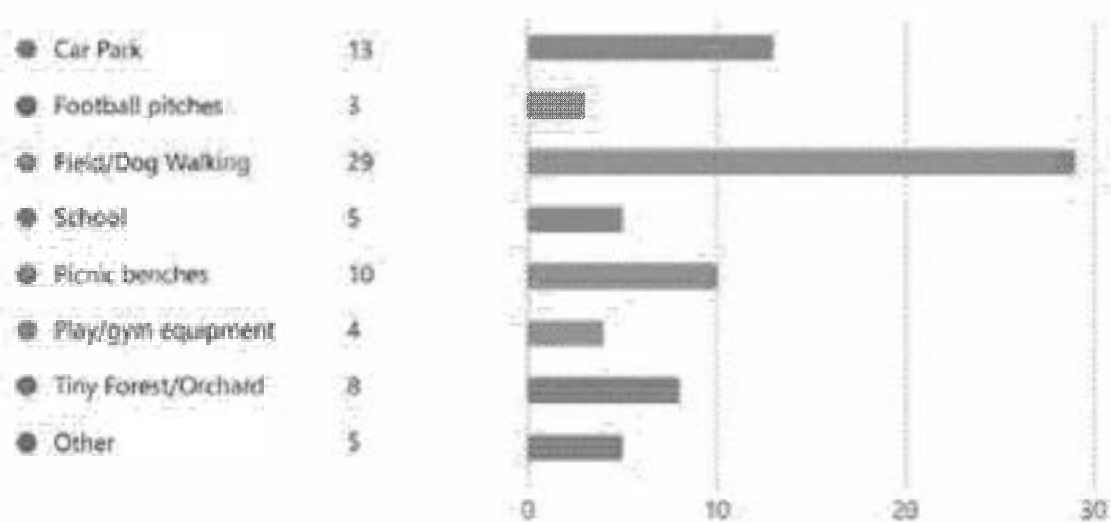

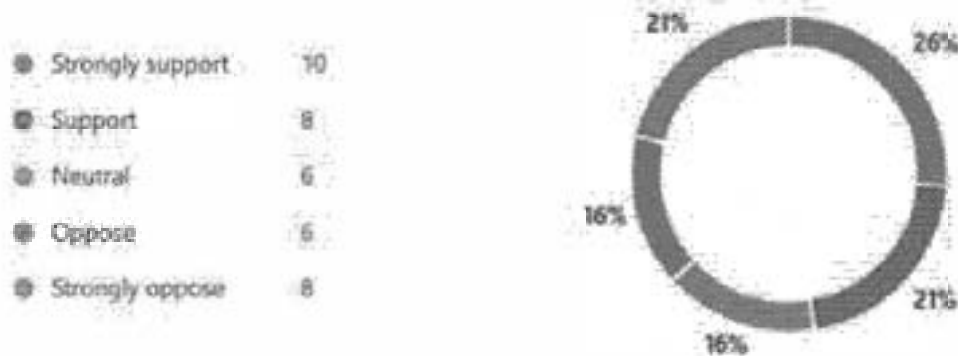

2. To what extent do you support the installation of electric gates and believe the benefits justify the investment?



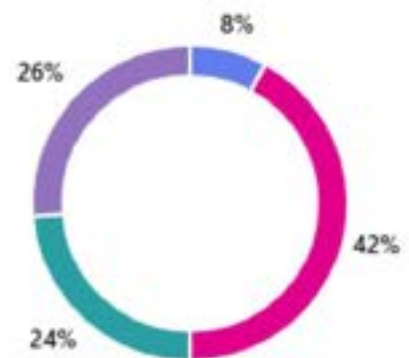
3. If electric gates were installed and the car park was available outside school hours, would you be more likely to use the site or car park and how often?

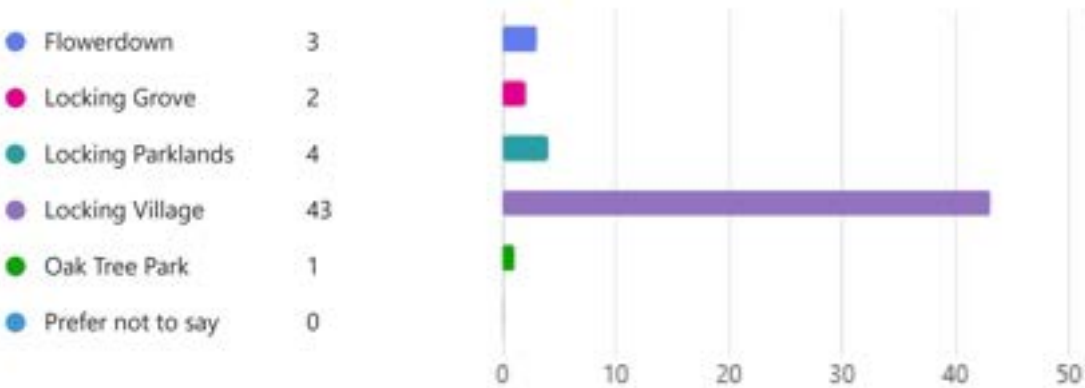

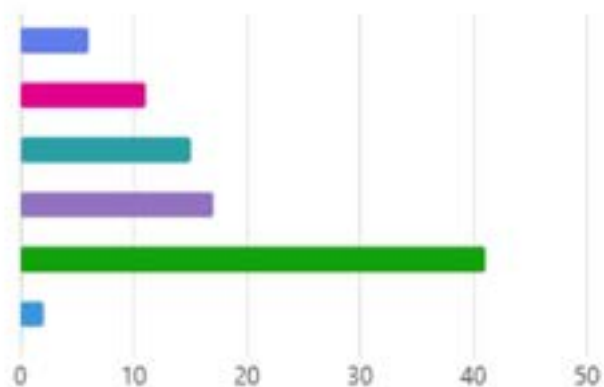

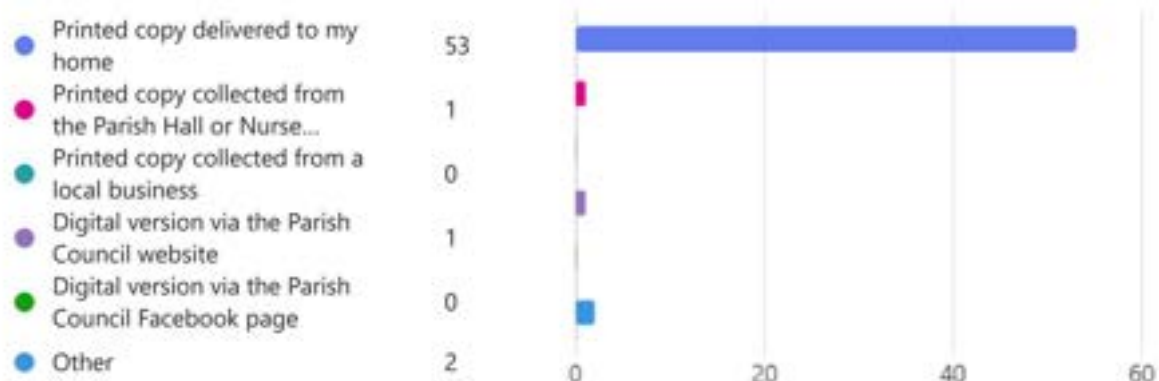

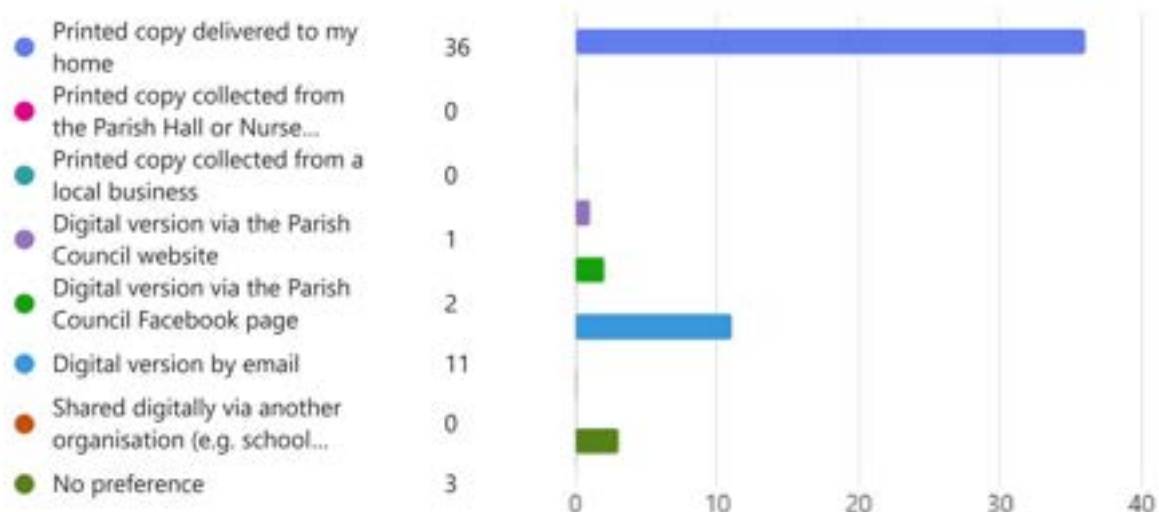

6. How do you usually access the Looking at Locking newsletter? (Select all that apply)

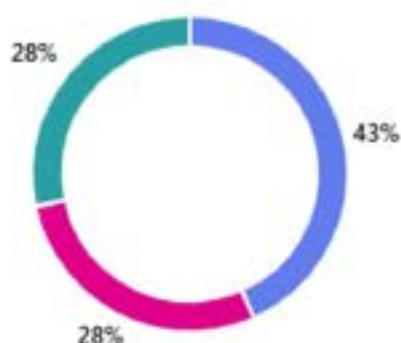

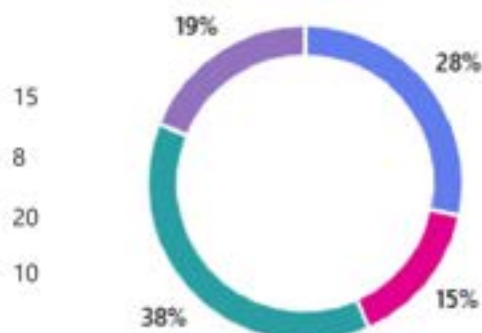

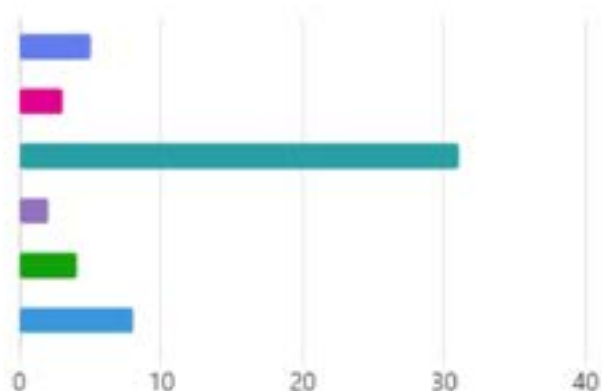

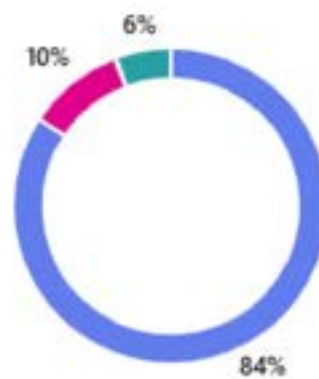
3. In your opinion, are violations of the one-way system on Mendip Rise:

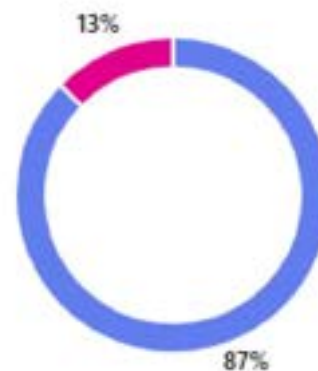
